What's New

This summer the town sand sealed the first three blocks of King Street and the first two blocks of Queen street and also resealed around the corner of Duchess Street and Prairie Avenue. The town is trialing insulating a water line on East end of Prince Street. Should it work well, council may look at doing other lines in the future. Tree trimming has been completed for this year by Weber's tree service. They trimmed up a few trees by the Anglican church and then did three blocks on Prince Street, this street has never been trimmed, so it was long overdue. The #1 well has seen some upgrades this summer. All the insulation was removed from the inside as the mice had destroyed it. Now the interior will have a spray on insulation installed as well as the exterior roof will be sprayed by Western Urethane. This will prevent mice from tunneling in the walls and preserve the roof from leaking. Council has made the decision to reconcile two of the bank accounts into the Town general account. The two accounts are the Long Lake Valley Court as well as the Imperial Cable system. All the reporting will remain separate but this now will allow for all cheques to be made out to the Town of Imperial, cable and water bills can be paid with one cheque.


Trees over the Sidewalks and back alleys

Long Lake Valley Court

Changes to the Long Lake Valley court, the monthly rent is \$950 this includes water, sewer, garbage, energy and snow removal. Tenants no longer require a \$40,000 refundable deposit upon signing a rental agreement, instead it will be a \$2500 damage deposit. Council feels that the \$40,000 is better left in the tenant's bank account as opposed to being held by the town. Anyone interested in putting their name on the waiting list is asked to contact the Town Office (963-2220) for more details. A \$1000.00 deposit is required to get your name on the list. Any questions feel free to contact the office.

Waste Transfer Station

The waste transfer station will be changing over to winter hours starting November 1-M arch 31. Hours will be Tuesdays & Saturdays from 12:00 pm - 5:00 pm. Please remember that all garbage bags being picked up by the town need to be tied and boxes broken down. The waste transfer station will now accept shingles by appointment only. You will need to know how many bundles you will be bringing in as we need to keep track of the weight. The cost will be \$7.50 per bundle and they will be put in the 40-yard bin. Yard & Garden Refuse

Please take your yard and garden refuse to the waste transfer station. Remember it is free of charge.

Tree branches & Leaves


Just a reminder that tree branches and leaves are now picked up semiannually. The next scheduled pick up is after the Thanksgiving long weekend. The spring pick up will be after the May long weekend. Tree branches and leaves are free to take to the waste transfer station, if you are unable to do so and would like the town to take them before a scheduled pick up you can call the office and for \$10.00 you can have them picked up. Reminder all leaves must be in a biodegradable bag for spring and fall pickup. Large biodegradable plastic leaf bags (35" x 55") are available at the town office for \$1.00 per bag.

Taxes

Just a friendly reminder that your taxes are due by December 31 to avoid penalty. Town office hours are $8:30 \text{ am} - 12:30 \text{ pm} \ 1:00 \text{pm} - 4:00 \text{ pm}$ Monday through Friday.

Permits

Permits are required for all new building construction; garages, carports, decks, mobile home; relocation of an existing building; demolition of an existing building; fireplaces, wood stoves & heaters; retaining walls; temporary buildings; renovations, alterations & additions to an existing building; & basement development in a dwelling unit **prior** to any work being undertaken.



Permit application forms can be obtained at the Town Office.
